FOCUS Common Nouns

A common noun is an idea, person, place, or thing. A common noun can be a single word, a group of words, or a hyphenated word and is capitalized only at the start of a sentence.

Examples: It takes *self-control* idea

for a teenager person to drive to school place in a sports car. thing
