



### Activity #2 Blending, Segmenting, and Spelling

Each lesson also introduces two high frequency **Heart Words**. Students blend the phonetically regular sound-spellings and map to orthographic memory "the part(s) you have to learn by heart." Three example words which share the same irregular sound-spellings are provided.

According to David Kilpatrick (2015), these "exception words are secured in long-term memory by the same orthographic mapping process as regular words."

## Heart Words Assessment

---

The purpose of this whole class assessment is to determine which of the 108 high frequency **Heart** Words students can and cannot accurately read. Teachers may also choose to dictate the words as a spelling assessment.

### Directions/Recording/Mastery

Pass out the **Heart Words Assessment** to students. Say—“This is a test to see if you can identify the words I say out loud and the letters which do not match their usual spellings. Listen carefully because I won’t repeat the words after the test is finished. On your test, find the first row of four words [Pause]. Fill in the capital letter that best matches the word I say.”

Let’s start with Number One. Ready?

Number One is *won won*

The swimmer won the gold medal. *won*

(Note that an example sentence is required because *won* is a homonym.

Example sentences are not necessary for all words in this assessment.)

Now, draw a heart or hearts above the letters which do not match their usual sounds. In other words, the *part* or *parts* you have to know by *heart*.

Watch how I do this. [Print on the board to demonstrate.]

For example, in the word, *won*, draw a heart above the *o*, because the the *o* spelling does not match the usual sound for the letter *o*. If a word has more parts which do not match their sounds, draw hearts above each of these letters.

or

Teachers may choose to instruct students to shade in the non-phonetic sound-spellings with their pencils instead of drawing the hearts.

Now, shade in the letters which do not match their usual sounds. In other words, the *part* or *parts* you have to know by *heart*.

Watch how I do this. [Print on the board to demonstrate.]

For example, in the word, *won*, shade in the *o*, because the the *o* spelling does not match the usual sound for the letter *o*. If a word has more parts which do not match their sounds, shade in each of these letters.

Grade the assessments with slashes through the numbered test items for student errors, and record the number of unmastered **Heart Words** in the pre-test column on the **Reading Mastery Matrix** for each student. Pass the graded test back to you students, along with sets of the numbered **Heart Words Game Cards**. Instruct students to remove the numbered cards that they need to master as sight words (the student errors indicated by slashes) and recycle those that they have already mastered.
